FORT COLLINS, CO. - Phi Delta Theta members and leaders from across the country and Canada will come together for a week of service, cultural immersion, and values exploration in Honduras this May. Trip participants will work alongside the people of Honduras on various projects. Participants will also have the opportunity to interact with local children at an orphanage, work with school children in the communities we visit, and learn more about the cultural and political history of the country.

From May 19-26, AFLV and Phi Delta Theta will partner with Heart to Honduras to plan and implement the service effort. The organization's goal is to address the various needs of the poor in Honduras and beyond. The organization focuses its efforts in providing Honduras's impoverished with: food, clothing, housing, healing, and hope.
